Football goals	£183	£0	These have allowed us to have more football games happening at any one time, thus allowing teachers to work with smaller groups and increase confidence and ability.
Hand pumps	£20	£20	Due to balls being replaced regularly, this hand pump has allowed the balls to be reused more efficiently.
Tag rugby belts	£0	£0	When playing tag rugby year groups enjoy playing all together so this has allowed us play all together and enhance team games
Bean bags	£49	£0	Needed to be replaced for EYFS and KS1 use due to breakage.
Cones	£40	£0	Due to cones breaking, these needed to be replaced for all years to use.
District sports entry fee	£200	£200	This event allows a handful of KS2 students take part in an athletics competition that they otherwise would not have had the chance to be involved in.
Sports4Kids sports coach	£16,500	£17000	This coach has continued to provide an opportunity for, during curriculum time, the children were given specific coaching in small groups each afternoon as part of the enrichment cycle. The smaller groups were beneficial in making sure every child knew more and was able to do more. The reception children benefited from small group lessons in line with the Early Years curriculum. The sports coach also allowed children to participate in sport beyond the PE lessons. He ran a variety of after school clubs Early Years/KS1 and KS2 clubs throughout the Spring and Summer term.
Primary PE planning subscription	£400	£425	The continued subscription to the online PE Scheme has had a positive impact on the consistency of the teaching of PE and increased confidence from the staff delivering the lessons, enabling the standard of PE lessons to improve.
Gymnastic Mats	£300	£0	Gymnastic mats need replacing and more children will be able to take part in floor work.



Basketball Nets	£434	£0	With this provision, the school will be able to introduce this sport and have it differentiated from our netball hoops. This will also be a provision to use at lunchtimes.
Netball post	£85	£0	This is due to a netball post breaking and needing to be replaced. It allows use of a netball court during lunch and PE lessons.
Tennis balls	£50	£0	Due to multiple classes completing PE lessons that involve tennis balls at one time, we have found that needed to be increase so that all pupils are active all the time.
Tennis Rackets	£480	£0	36 Tennis Rackets to replace old rackets
Internal clubs for enrichment opportunities	£1527	£1857	Encouraging more girls to participate in extra curricular sporting activities.  Build cultural capital for all pupils including PPG pupils.
Internal CPD	£300	£0	To enhance understanding of OAA activities

## What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and the money goes directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The boost in self-confidence, self-esteem, and social skills among these students translates into their academic pursuits and overall well-being.
