Improving Literacy in KS2

Develop pupils' language capabilities



- collaborative learning activities where pupils can share their thought processes;
- reading books aloud and discussing them, including use of structured questioning;
- and pupils articulating their ideas verbally before writing.

Improving Literacy in KS2

Support pupils to develop fluent reading capabilities



- Develop pupils' fluency through:
- guided oral reading instruction teachers model fluent reading, then pupils read the same text aloud with appropriate feedback; and
- repeated reading—pupils re-read a short and meaningful passage a set number of times or until they reach a suitable level of fluency.

Improving Literacy in KS2

Teach reading comprehension strategies through modelling and supported practice



- Teach specific strategies that pupils can apply to monitor and overcome barriers to comprehension. These include:
- prediction (based on text content and context);
- · questioning;
- clarifying;
- summarising; and
- activating prior knowledge.
- Model and scaffold these strategies; then support pupils to increasingly use reading comprehension strategies independently, with less and less prompting from the teacher.

Why do we use AR at Whiteknights?

A web-based programme.

'Real-world' books.

Helps pupils to develop comprehension skills.

Develops independent reading.

Encourages children to read for pleasure.

Children experience success.

Pupil book choice (doesn't use book bands)

Measures progress over time.

Accelerated Reader

Database of over 35000 quizzes

Ensures comprehension of books read

Provides instant feedback

Helps create culture of reading

When pupils have been given their ZPD range, they then choose a book within this range.

Books in school have a sticker on the spine with the book level.

Might also wish to choose a book from home, if it has a quiz.


Pupils should read for at least 20 minutes a day.

What is ZPD?

Zone of Proximal Development

In the context of AR, it is the range within which pupils should read to best develop their reading.

Recorded in Home Learning Diaries 5 days each week.



Library books

Do not have an orange sticker on the spine.

May be in the AR system. You can check online and do the quiz if there is.

Might be above their ZPD if you read the book with your child.

Choosing a book

Book level

- Range between 0.2-13.5
- Calculated based on sentence length and vocabulary difficulty

Interest level

- LY approximately age 5-8
- MY approximately age 9-13
- UY approximately age 14+


How to access the Reading Practice quiz





Growth

Quizzes must be accessed through school website specifically



Reading Practice quiz

When pupils have finished reading the book, they complete the Reading Practice quiz (note, this is different to STAR test which is completed in school).

Quiz taken on a laptop or tablet (such as iPad).

Quiz must be taken within 24 hours of finishing the book.

Should be completed independently.

Books should not be used.

No time limit.

Varying number of questions (3, 5, 10 and 20).

Results immediately displayed.



Celebrating achievement

Pass rate varies depending on the quiz (e.g. quizzes have different number of questions).

Each classroom has an Accelerated Reader display.

When a pupil passes a Reading Practice quiz, they add a house point to the display. These are collated termly.

How can you help your child?

Read with your child.

Focus on developing comprehension.

Talk about the meaning of new words to help develop vocabulary.

Ask your child questions about what they have read.

Speak to CT.
