Maths	We will continue our exploration of ratio
	and move on understand how to use these
	skills to answer word problems. We will
	then study percentage, area, perimeter,
	volume and some statistic work.
Reading	We will be reading two different texts: The
	Highwayman (a narrative poem) and Crime
	and Punishment (a non-fiction text).
Art	We will be exploring art based on
	pointillism. We will be taking inspiration
	from Yayoi Kusama and exploring how
	pointillism has evolved over the years since
	Georges Seurat created the technique.
History	Linking to our reading text, we are going to
Thistory	be discussing whether Highwaymen are
	villains or heroes. We will do this by
	answering a series of questions that
	include, when did they exist and why did
	they. Police officers from Thames Valley
	Police will help us understand how our
	learning links to modern day policing.
Computing	In Computing, we are going to explore how
	to create an algorithm that sorts numbers.
	We are taking inspiration from Ada
	Lovelace and merging the worlds of maths
	and computing together!
Science	Our focus this half term will be light. Pupils
	will continue to deepen their
	understanding by exploring light within the
	natural world and understanding different
	aspects like refraction and reflection.
RE	This term, we will be answering the
	question: Is anything ever eternal? We will
	have a guest workshop from REInspired
	that digs deeper into this topic.
Latin	The pupils will be understanding how Latin
	noun endings are changed by the subject
	and object. They will explore this by looking
	at how people were remembered and
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	honoured in the Roman times.

PE	Over the half term, the children will be practising the skills of netball. They will understand the rules, develop their skills in throwing and catching and also work on shooting and defending.
Jigsaw	This half term's focus is Dreams and Goals. Children will be setting themselves goals for both in and out of school. We will then explore the steps and struggles we may go through to achieve these objections.
Music	This term our focus piece is 'Fingal's Cave' by Mendelssohn (1830) which is a classical piece depicting the sea and waves swirling around Fingal's cave which is in the Inner Hebrides, Scotland. The children will be able to define pitch, dynamics and texture.
