

FREE SCHOOL MEALS: Did you know registering for free school meals helps get extra funds for school?

To qualify, your child must be in school and you must be receiving one of the following benefits:

Income support Income based Job Seekers Allowance Income related Employment and Support Allowance NASS support \Rightarrow \Rightarrow Guarantee element of State Pension Child Tax Credit, provided you're not also entitled to --- \Rightarrow Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190 Working Tax Credit for the four weeks after \Rightarrow employment ends Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400 If this applies to you but your child isn't registered for free school meals, complete a form and return it to your child's school. Download the form and apply for Free School Meals on Wokingham Borough Council's website.
