WHOLE-SCHOOL NOTICES

- MYMATHS: Just a reminder that we are no longer using the MyMaths programme.
- WINTER UNIFORM: When pupils return after the half term holiday, Year 3-6 will be expected to wear our winter uniform; a collared shirt and tie. No summer dresses please.

As the weather is now becoming inclement, please ensure your child is provided with a waterproof/winter coat on a daily basis.

- CONSIDERATE PARKING: Please park considerately when dropping/picking your child up from school. We have had a number of complaints from local residents of driveways being blocked and pavements being mounted, therefore not allowing pushchairs or pedestrians past. Also, a reminder that the bollard is in operation the following times: 8:15am—9:00am and again from 3:00pm—3:45pm. The bollard will not be taken down under ANY circumstances!
- WHOLE SCHOOL INDIVIDUAL AND SIBLING PHOTOS:
 On Thursday 2nd November, photographers will be in school to take individual child photos and photos of siblings together. All school siblings will be photographed together during the school day.

From 8.15-8.45am the photographers will be set up in Onyx Classroom to take family sibling group photographs. This is for children only, and an opportunity for you to have your Whiteknights children photographed with younger (and older) siblings. This is not the time for school siblings only to get a photo – as advised, this will take place during the school day. If you wish to take advantage of this opportunity you should access the school through the reception area, and leave by the same route.

Please try and make sure your children are neat and tidy on the day and dressed in their winter uniforms. If you have a nursery child who is not usually in on a Thursday please bring them in at 9am to participate in the photo session. Nursery will be our first class, so you will be able to take them home straight after the photo is taken.

LEAVING CLASSROOM/WALKING HOMER PERMISSIONS: Pupils in Year 3 and upwards can be given permission to leave the classroom/walk home on their own. Are they ready for this? Please read this very useful guide to determine if they are:



KS2 WALKING HOME UNACCOMPANIED

In order to ensure children's safety, only children in Key Stage 2 are allowed to walk home on their own. Children in Key Stage 1 need to be collected by an adult (it is not appropriate for an older sibling in KS2 to walk them home).

This does not mean that all children in KS2 are ready to walk home on their own. Parents need to consider their child's age, maturity and independence, as well as their distance from the school and the safety of the route before making a decision about whether or not it is safe for each child to walk home unaccompanied by an adult.

HELPFUL TIPS FOR ASSESSING YOUR CHILD'S READINESS

How do you know if your child is ready to walk or ride his/her bike to and from school? By discussing possible scenarios with him/her. Ideally, your child should know the following twelve points before she/he is ever alone in public. Talk about each one of the twelve points listed below from Gavin de Becker's book, Protecting the Gift to help establish their readiness or areas to support them with

- Are you as the parent strong enough to hear about any experience your child has had, no matter how
- Does your child know it's okay to be assertive?
- 6 Does your child know how to choose who to ask?
- Does your child know it's okay to strike, even to injure, someone if he believes he is in danger, and that you'll support any action he takes as a result of feeling uncomfortable or afraid?
- - Does your child know that if someone ever tries to force him to go somewhere, what he screams should include. "This is not my father"?
- - Onlookers seeing a child scream or even struggle are likely to assume the adult is a parent.
- Does your child know that if someone says, "Don't yell", the thing to do is yell? The corollary is if someone
- Does your child know to fully resist ever going anywhere out of public view with someone he doesn't know, and particularly to resist going anywhere with someone who tries to persuade him?



Please be on the look out for **MyChildsArt** artwork forms that will be sent home this week. This is one of our very popular fundraising initiatives for Christmas. Turn your child's artwork into unique and special gifts to give to your loved ones this Christmas. Parents can choose from a full range of over 20 products.

Artwork designs must be returned by the 3rd of November.



For best printed results we recommend full coverage designs that use bright / bold felt-tip pens.



The sheets are processed using a high speed roller-fed scanner, so please DO NOT stick anything onto the artwork sheet as this will not feed through the scanner properly.

If you are using paint, please ensure this is not applied too thickly and that the sheets are completely dry before packing, If not, quite often they get stuck (either to each other or whiist going through the scanner) which tears the artwork sheet - spoiling the child's picture and all their hard work!
