With the Summer term now underway, we are pleased that projections for next September see BPET schools full at 92% (average across all of them). We work hard in setting up the best environment for pupils to Learn, Enjoy and Succeed, and are proud to see these results, especially with a well-known 7% drop in children's population in London.

We are delighted to announce the recent appointment of key positions across BPET.

Learning reviews

Each year, every BPET school is subject to a Learning Review as part of our school improvement review cycle.

This is a peer-review process led by BPET Headteachers supported by Deputy and Assistant Headteachers, as well as an external consultant.

The aim of the review is to observe the quality of teaching, and provide coached feedback in order to support staff in their continuing professional development. Pupils are also given the opportunity to offer feedback on their learning experience via an anonymous survey.

This year's reviews have provided each school with individual feedback around their strengths and areas for development, which help formulate plans for next year's priorities.

Competitions

The BPET competition season is well underway, as you can see from the images on the left hand side! We love offering our pupils the chance to get excited about competing with their peers across a variety of disciplines.

The challenges sharpen their focus, give them something to aim for, a sense of achievement besides the outcome, and create team spirit.

The football tournaments have now con-

cluded with Braywick Court School and Halley House School winning the boys' section for the Berkshire and London's hubs respectively.

With a national lack of girls' football in schools, we are proud to be offering our girls the chance to train and compete: 74 girls took part in our tournament with Evendons Primary School and Deer Park Primary School winning the trophies for the Berkshire and London's hubs.

The Queen's Gambit - our chess competition facilitated by Chess in Schools - saw pupils from Whitehall Park School and Braywick Court School winning the coveted team trophies. 450 Year 4 pupils across eight BPET schools spent the last month perfecting their times tables within our first ever TT Rockstars Competition.

The competition helps children practising timestables, embedding maths knowledge and preparing them for the national Multiplications Table Check.

















A staggering 1 million questions were answered correctly (1,313,746) by pupils within this competition alone.

Ofsted's visit to Whiteknights

Whiteknights Primary School was visited by Ofsted inspectors on 28 Feb and 1 March and was judged as Good in all areas.

The Ofsted report highlights the academic rigour and high achievement of the pupils who enjoy the school's structured curriculum.

The excellent reputation of the school amongst parents was also recognised: "Parents hold the school in high esteem and are full of praise for the education and care that their children receive."
