
YEAR 3 ROMAN INSPIRED POTTERY

As part of their topic on the Romans, Year 3 have been exploring Roman pottery. The children created coil clay pots using techniques similar to those used in Roman times, helping them to understand how pottery was made and used.

They learned about the two main types of Roman pottery: coarse ware for everyday use and fine ware for decorative and special occasions. The pupils also explored the work of ceramic designer Pip Wilcox, linking past techniques to modern practice.

Art lessons required the children to use traditional methods such as coiling, layering, and etching decorative designs. These skills were challenging to master, but the children showed great resilience and pride in their finished pots.





WINTER OLYMPICS IN OPAL CLASS

Opal class have been watching a little bit of the winter Olympics before or after reading, during snack time or the end of the day.

They have been very surprised and interested at all of the sports. Especially watching the ice skater Ilia Malinin do his backflips on the ice!




YEAR 2 GET CREATIVE IN MUSIC AND ART

Year 2 have had a very creative week in both Music and Art. In Art, the children created animal clay sculptures and learned about their key artist, Joan Miró, a painter, sculptor, and ceramicist born in Barcelona in 1893. An interesting fact the children enjoyed learning is that Miró often used bright colours and playful shapes inspired by dreams and imagination, believing that art should feel free and joyful.

In Music, Year 2 practised keeping a steady rhythm and worked hard to hold their recorders correctly. They focused on covering the holes firmly to produce the notes B and A.




YEAR 3 RE-INSPIRED

This week Year 3 were visited by RE-Inspired. In these sessions they learned about miracles and explored the key question: ***Could Jesus really perform miracles, or is there another explanation?***

The children were encouraged to debate, share their ideas, and justify their thinking with one another and with our visitors.

They listened to the story of the paralysed man, worked collaboratively on a craft activity, and performed a short drama based on Jesus calming the storm.



