Whitehall Park School - Junior investigators

Junior investigators

Whitehall Park School launched a child-led research project in partnership with the STEP-IN Consortium, led by London Metropolitan University. The initiative is part of a wider study focused on tackling rising rates of type 2 diabetes and reducing health inequalities in underserved communities. Pupils in Years 5 and 6 are “junior investigators” working directly with university researchers through hands-on STEAM workshops. This new programme gives children real ownership of their learning while promoting health awareness, cultural sensitivity and inclusivity.

Excellent outcomes for disadvantaged pupils

Halley House School, Kilburn Grange School and Whiteknights Primary School have each received a letter from Secretary of State for Education Bridget Phillipson congratulating them on their exceptional outcomes for disadvantaged pupils in 2024/25.

The letter was sent to the top 25% schools nationally, based on outcomes for disadvantaged pupils. The letter praised the schools as being “among the very best nationally”, highlighting the dedication of staff and the hard work of pupils.
